Six Found Guilty on February 12, 2024

MOUNT VERNON – Judge John Thatcher found six guilty after hearings were held in the Mount Vernon Municipal Court on February 12, 2024.

Anthony Campise, 47, of Howard, was found guilty of theft.

Brian Mainwaring, 47, of Coshocton, was found guilty of reckless operation of a motor vehicle.

Christi Ramirez, 64, of Mount Vernon, was found guilty of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and/or a drug of abuse.

Zachariah Clark, 37, of Mount Vernon, was found guilty of two counts of operating a motor vehicle while under suspension.

Eric Driscoll, 46, of Mount Vernon, was found guilty of improper passing.

Cody Tone, 19, of Mount Vernon, was found guilty of abandoning animals.
